William Campbell was a law partner of Campbell, Thomas and Burke. He was a member of the Allegheny County (Pa.) and American Bar Associations, The American Law Institute and the American Judicature Society.

He was a director of North American Rockwell Corporation when it was known as Standard Steel Spring Company and later, Rockwell-Standard Corporation. He also served as director of Coraopolis National Bank, which merged with the Union National Bank, which later merged with the Union National Bank of Pittsburgh and Coraopolis Trust Company; the Ohio Valley Trust Company, which merged with Coraopolis Savings and Trust Company; and the Coraopolis Trust Office of The Union National Bank of Pittsburgh.

During World War I, Major Campbell instructed in trench and small arms weapons at Fort Sill, Okla., and Camp Meade in Maryland. He had been a member of the Cadet Corps at Grove City College and received his commission at Ft. Niagara in 1917. Campbell was a member of Coraopolis Borough Council.

Campbell served the Grove City College community as a member of the Board of Trustees and past president of the Alumni Council.

He passed away.
