Stanley Johnson was appointed director, management information systems, for Worldport LA in 1988, the largest U.S. port in container volume and largest West Coast port for cruise traffic. At Worldport LA, he was responsible for the port's worldwide information technology environment, including application development, telecommunications, end-user computing and operations/technical support. He previously served in IT management positions in the aerospace industry, at the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power, and in the Los Angeles City government. He retired in 1997.

An Army veteran, Johnson received significant industry and corporate honors and has traveled, published and lectured worldwide. He chaired the Southern California Chapter of the Society of Information Management, the world's leading IT executive organization; the IT advisory board at the University of California, Long Beach; and the UCLA Anderson School of Management Information Systems Associates. In addition, he served on the editorial board of *Corporate Computing Magazine*. He currently lectures pro bono at the Anderson School, and was named a public sector fellow at the school. He has been involved in assisting people with disabilities for more than 30 years and served as chair and board member of the Westside Center for Independent Living.

Johnson is past president of the Grove City College Alumni Council. He also received the Distinguished Service Award in 2010. He joined the College's Board of Trustees in 1995 and became a Trustee Emeritus in 2012.
