The Rev. Dr. Norman Koehler is priest emeritus at St. Thomas Episcopal Church in Oakmont, Pa., and a volunteer in pastoral care at Presbyterian Sentor Care.

He entered active service in the U.S. Navy in 1956 following two years in reserve. He became a naval aviator in 1958 and retired as a captain. He served in Vietnam. Other military assignments included assistant Naval attaché to Greece, Commanding Officer; Patrol Squadron Ten, director of special operations in the Atlantic Command; executive assistant to secretary of the Navy; and commanding officer at the Naval Air Station in Brunswick, Maine.
