The Rev. Ross S. McClintock





The Rev. Ross McClintock served as pastor of Highland Presbyterian Church, Lancaster, Pa. His congregation started with 900 members and grew to more than 2,000. He also helped establish the Wayside Presbyterian Church in Landisville. He served the Highland church for 25 years until his retirement in 1992. At that time, he was named pastor emeritus.

He was active in the leadership of Donegal Presbytery, serving as moderator and chairman of the committee on ministry.

Before joining Highland Church, he pastored at churches in Persywille, Greencastle and Pittsburgh. The Pittsburgh Presbytery also benefited from his works as vice chairman of the ministerial relations committee and a commissioner to the Synod of Pennsylvania.

McClintock advocated mission outreach work and supported Habitat for Humanity, Contact Lancaster and the Samaritan Center. Rev. McClintock was vice president of the Community Library Board and a God and Country award chairman for Boy Scouts of America. He was also a member of National Trust for Historic Preservation U.S.A; Cliosophic Society, Lancaster; James Buchanan Foundation for the Preservation of Wheatland; and the Lancaster Art Museum.

He passed away Nov. 18, 2003.
