Dr. Donald L. McMillan

Class of 1932



After receiving his M.D. degree, Donald McMillan served an internship at Allegheny General Hospital, Pittsburgh. He was a surgical resident at that hospital until 1939. During his nearly 30-year practicing career, first in Glenshaw and after World War II in Mt. Lebanon (Pittsburgh), McMillan was both a practicing physician and a surgeon.

McMillan was associated with St. Clair Memorial Hospital beginning in 1946. He served as chief of the medical service and a member of the executive committee of this hospital. He also was team physician for Mt. Lebanon High School. McMillan's hobby was sports, and he had a strong interest in the Grove City College sports program.

This likely goes back to his high school and college days when he was Butler County Tennis Champion in 1928 and 1929, and was a member of the Grove City College varsity tennis team. In later years, he was president of the Junior Tennis Development Program for Mt. Lebanon. Because of his love for his College and his intense interest in its sports program, McMillan spent many years talking to high school athletes in the Pittsburgh area, urging them to attend Grove City College.

Prior to his retirement, McMillan maintained a practice in Mt. Lebanon for 50 years, including 38 years as team doctor for the local high-school football teams. On September 9, 2000, the College named its newly constructed press box at Thorn Field in his honor.

He passed away Dec. 31, 2002.
